



# OpenScholar Menu Changes: August 2017 Update

## Summary



This document highlights the changes in the Admin Bar after OpenScholar's August 2017 update. This Admin Bar design change relates to the location of the Admin Bar, a physical separation of the My Account menu, and a more logical grouping of items within the Admin Bar. The Admin Bar can also be collapsed, allowing the site member to see more of the page.



**Content** is now **Site Content** in the new menu. The new Site Content menu has three options, **Browse**, **Add**, and **Import** that expand out when you click on each.

## Adding Content

In the new menu to add content, click on the **Add** menu item under **Site Content** and choose the item you want to add to the site.



## Find Content is now Browse

**Find** menu under **Content** is now the **Browse** menu under **Site Content**. In the old menu, Comments can be viewed, now Files is separated into Files and Private Files. Blog comments are



no longer an option to browse in the new menu. You can view blog comments by going to Site Content > Browse > Content. Click on Type > Blog Entry and click Apply. You can search the blog entries for comments by clicking on the Title.



**Import Content** menu is now located under **Site Content** instead of Content.



The **Menus** item is now a stand-alone menu item. It used to be located under Build > Menu.

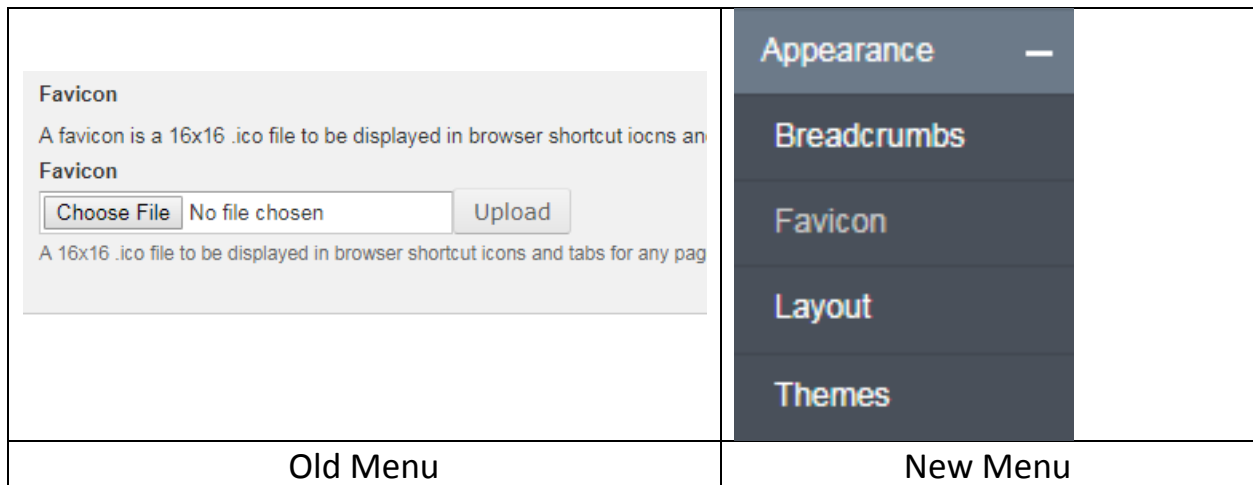

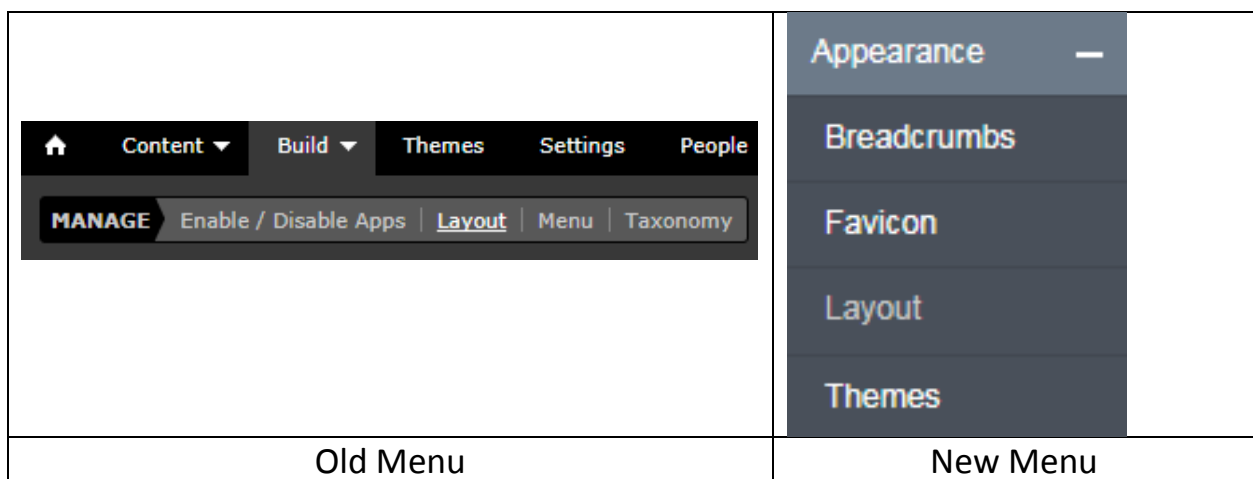
**Breadcrumbs** in the new menu are under **Appearance**. Breadcrumbs in the old menu were under Settings.

## Favicon





**Favicon** is now under **Appearance** in the new menu. Favicon in the old menu was under Settings.

## Layout





The new **Layout** menu is now located under **Appearance**. The old Layout menu was located under Build.



**Taxonomy** is now its **own menu item** in the new menu. Taxonomy was located under Build in the old menu.


The old Settings menu was a stand-alone item. **Settings** in the new menu contains **Enable/Disable Apps** (in old menu was located under Build), **App Settings** (which was located on the Disable/Enable Apps page), and **Global Settings** (which has some of the settings located on the Settings page in the old menu).



In the new menu, **Enable/Disable Apps** is located under **Settings**. In the old menu Enable/Disable Apps was located under Build.



In the new menu, **App Settings** are located under **Settings**, and each of the items' settings is displayed as a new window when you click on the App name. In the old menu, App Settings were listed on the page after you clicked on Enable/Disable Apps.

In the old menu, most of the items listed under Settings are now under **Global Settings** in the new menu.



## Cache/Reindex



In the new menu, **Cache/ Reindex** located under **Global Settings**. In the old menu, Cache/ Reindex was listed under the Settings page.

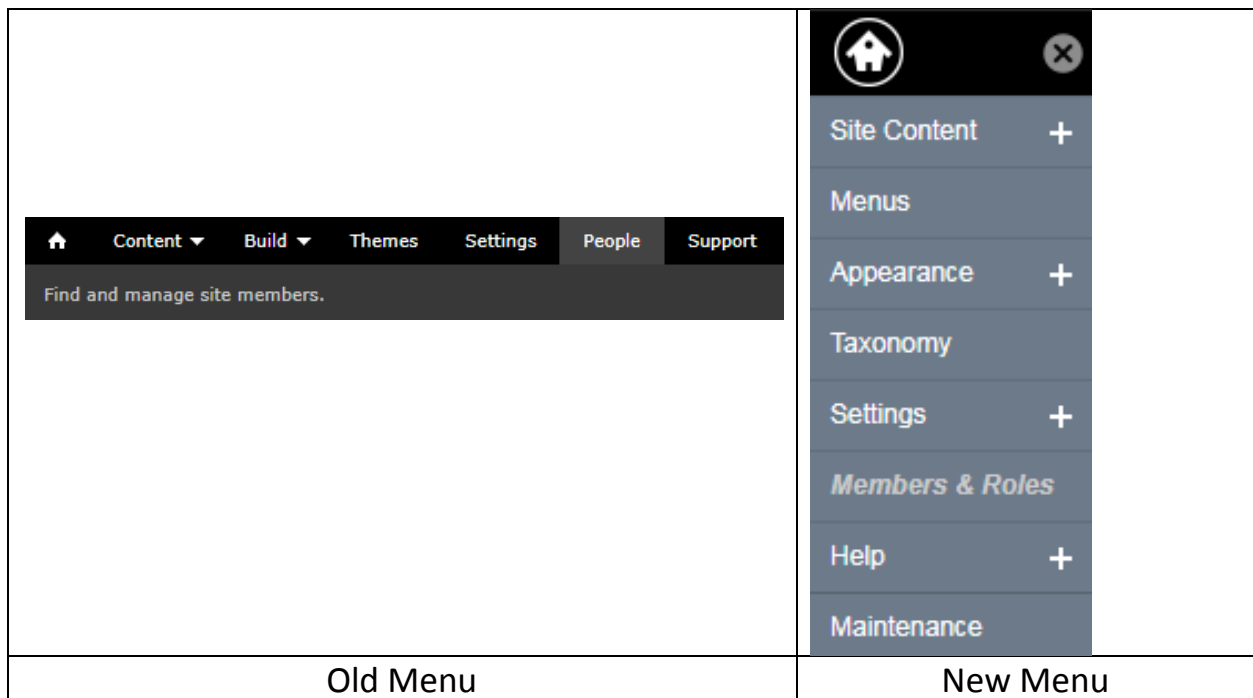
In the new menu, **Google Analytics** is located under **Global Settings**. In the old menu, Google Analytics was located under the Settings page.

In the new menu, **Site Visibility** is located under **Settings > Global Settings > Site Visibility**. In the old menu, Site Visibility was located under the Settings page.

## Members and Roles



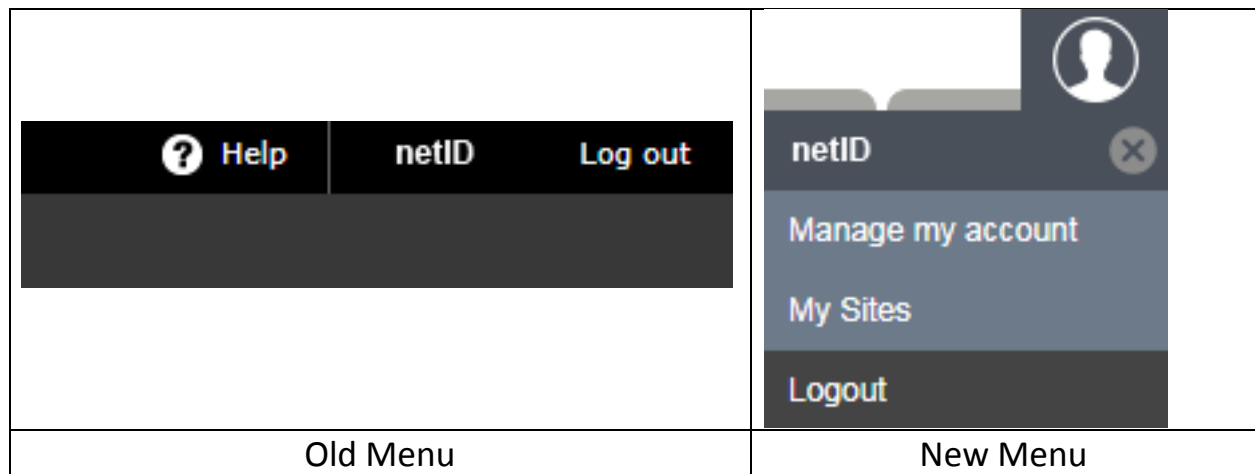
In the new menu, **adding people** is now under **Members & Roles**. To add members to a site in the old menu, you would go to People.

## Home Button



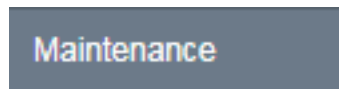
The Home button is located as the first item in both the old and new menu. The design of the Home button as changed.

## My Account



In the new menu, **My Account is separated out from the Admin menu** and you have options to see your account settings or your sites. The old menu in OpenScholar had the user account menu part of the Admin Bar.

## Maintenance



The **Maintenance option** is a fairly new option on the Admin Menu. Clicking on it will take you to an Upgrade and Outages page on the OpenScholar FAQ site.
